I received information from a researcher giving information for those using computers. He recommends thhe program Phone Search USA by DeLorme. They are on 3 CD ROM's containing every listed phone number (with name and address) in the US. It provides mailing lists which can be used to send mass mailings to certain names in particular areas of the country. It is best with those unusual surnames of course. An additional program, Street Atlas USA, will map any address. He says — when I leave home for research I have maps of locations for archives, historical collections, motels, libraries, and court houses. Saves a bunch of time. This information is from:

I have seen three computer programs for family history which I would recommend. They are Family Tree Maker for Windows by Broderbund. Family Origins for Windows from Parsons and Personal Ancestral File (PAF) from LDS in Utah.

I have PAF which I find hard to follow. The FAmily Origins I have just received and find it much easier to use. The Family Origins has an import/export system that lets you move your information from PAF to Family Origins. Have not used this part of the program as yet ----am still learning the program but will do this as soon as I feel confident doing so.

Do you have information concerning the use of computers in genealogy you wish to share. We could all benefit from ideas and suggestions in a computer column in our newsletters. I know not everyone has a computer, but there are some of you considering purchasing one and could use the information as to what programs etc. to buy.

Do we have anyone out there who would like to write a column for the newsletter concerning computers for use in genealogy. Personally, I am not really qualified for this type of column.....I am still learning and this is one old dog who is having trouble learning new ways with computers.

East Texas tombstones offer silent testimony to a family's history

The purple rental car looked out of place. Tall weeds disappeared under its bumper as it pulled along the sandy road, slipping deeper into the thicket of East Texas.

Blue skies opened briefly on this hot summer day, and windshield wipers flapped.

The road is no more than a trail. The terrain rises and falls, like the fortunes of those who came here to escape private demons or seek personal fortunes.

Up ahead is a clearing.

It took me four decades to appreciate this spot in the deep woods. How could I expect my daughters — Robin, 8, and Katie, 11 — to relate to these time-worn tombstones just ahead? But today there is a link. My daughters are here — on a graveyard tour — not because they were made to, but because they are curious about their past.

Branches of the family tree sprouted across the Southeast, and came together in one solid trunk in these dark, brooding woods in the mid-1800s. One relative — a signer of the Texas Declaration of Independence — left behind in Alabama a simple forwarding address: "George Washington Smyth, Texas, In the Western Woods."

Others moved from Georgia in 1849. They named this East Texas community Peachtree. One was a riverboat captain who hauled cotton out of Bevilport, now just a boat dock on the tea-colored Angelina River.

They called these woods home, and, one way or the other, after time ran its course, they ended up at the clearing just ahead.

My daughters and I have seen these people only in old tattered, barely-in-one-piece photos. Some of them hang on the walls of our house, seated atop horses in front of the old farmhouse.

Robin and Katie have peered, too, at the photo of a baptism group standing waist-deep in Sunday finest in the farm's stock pond. My grandmother is there as a teenager.

Memories once grew on the family farm, but now they are all here — memories of people I never knew, memories that are hard to connect with — not just for me, but for Katie and Robin, too.

The cemetery is tiny, hidden from the world and ancient, with just a dozen or so graves and a bit of rusted wrought iron.

Uncle Bob, my great-grandfather, is buried here. He was a farmer and stockman who spent 80 of his 87 years here, cultivating his land for 60 consecutive years.

An inscription on one tombstone reflects the realities of frontier Texas: "She was too good, too fair and too gentle to live in this world of despair." Katie and Robin ponder it in the light rain, swatting gnats from their bare legs, and move on.

We linger, but now the rain comes harder, the gnats swarm thicker, and it's time to go. A link has been made that will not be broken.

Katie and Robin walk past the baby who died just days after birth, and pause for the last monument, that of their great-grandmother, Ida Desdie Childers.

Imagine her life. Her home was on a farm carved from the thick timber. Her life was full of hardships, but she survived them all.

Her tombstone is small and unassuming, yet it speaks with the wisdom of the centuries, and it leaves us with a message of stubbornness and stress, but of success, too. And it is said with amazing simplicity: "She hath done what she could."

What more is there?
