Well. I hope this finds everyone high and dry. We have had record breaking rains and floods.....hope everyone is O.K.

This is going to be a hard issue to write. It is full of bad news. To let you know how my life has been going. I must tell you why I have made the decisions I am making.

About 3 years ago I was operated on for emergency gall bladder surgery. During this surgery the doctors found I have cirrhosis of the liver..if you have any knowledge of this problem...the liver was hard and cobblestoned. meaning the disease had taken a toll on the liver. I was informed there was no medication - no treatment and I am not a liver transplant possibility.. in other words there was nothing they can do for me. All the usual response to cirrhosis of the liver is "did you ever abuse alcohol"..NO NO NO...they scanned me for everything possible and found nothing to indicate the "why" of the problem. I have been doing O.K. these past 3 years but am beginning to have mild daily pain. About a month ago I spent several days in the hospital. Had a good going over and I am statis quo.

On April 20 1997, my brother, Ottis Wilton Bateman passed away. He had had a terrible fight with diabetes...a double amputee. 2 heart by-pass operations and eye surgery. He fought the good fight and died in his sleep.

My 88 year old mother is moving in with Duane and I. She is alone and need the contact of family.

Wait there is more.....

For the past 18 years I have published The CHILDRESS CHATTER. I am proud to say I have never missed getting an issue out. There has been over 850 pages of research material published....with the help of all of you. I am quitting publication with the Oct. issue of this year. In July when the usual Jul issue goes out, you will also receive the Oct. issue which will be my last issue.

I will be sending JoAnn & Bob Childers ALL of my material. Joann and I are looking for someone who would like to take on the responsibility of publishing the Chatter. and getting them out on time. If you think you would like to do this, give it some serious thought and be aware of the work that goes into getting out a publication such as this. I will gladly guide you in this effort. After 18 years of this I do believe I know what I am doing and will pass on the info to you. Subscription price....copy cost....mailing costs etc. etc. There are about 85-100 subscribers as of now. This usually will change by a few number at the beginning of a new year.

If the publisher of the Chatter would like to change the name of this publication they are welcome to do so.

I will retain the privilege of selling and marketing the past issues. It would be nice of the new editor to make a statement in each future issue that past issues may be purchased through me. The price of these past issues will remain as they are now....\$12.00 per year for 4 issues. Should copy work go

up drastically or postage get out of sight. the price will change.

THE WORK BOOK...I would like to find someone to take this over also. I have made many pencil notation on my copy of the Workbook and will send this to whoever takes charge of trying to document and prove the statements printed in it and send out updated sheets as needed to those who purchased the workbook. You will also receive a copy of the wall chart which has been used in the last few annual meetings. Names and addresses of purchasers of the workbook will be furnished to you. There are about 35 as of now.

I am also sending Joann computer disks of marriages etc. In other words I am trying to pass on ALL the material I have on the CHILDERS/CHILDRESS families. I did not want to place it in a library where it might get placed in the "storeroom" until "we can find a place to put it". This way it will stay in the hands of family.

Joann I am sorry to drop this on you....but you already have over 4000 pages of material I sent before. so this will finish off the complete "set".

If you have an interest in doing any of the work needed....please let us know. And of course after having put so much blood, sweat and tears into this 18 year effort — I would like to remain in contact with what is going on in each quarter and would appreciate being put on mailing lists.

Whoever takes over any of this work will have until Jan. 1 1998 to start a new year with a new publication. during this time I'll help you get started answer questions.

I got your e-mail address from Chad Childers but was given your name more than 10 years ago by Virginia Childers Zeboski of Sacramento. I have not heard from Virginia for a long time unfortunately. I am a direct descendant of Hugh Childers of East Retford, Nottinghamshire, England whose cousin (?) Abraham Childers went to Virginia in 1660. Supposedly all American Childers are connected to this one man although many records were lost when Richmond was destroyed in the Civil War. I am sure this is very familiar ground to you and you probably have the full history of Abraham. The point of my letter is that Childers is a very rare and unusual name in Australia and there are very few members of our family left in England. Only two families (mine and one other in Western Australia) can be located in our telephone books. There are only a few Childers in the London Directory. So how come all you American Childers have thrived in such numbers.

Dear Mrs. Reigard:

I am writing to you in regards to Childress geneology. Your name and address were given to me by Rev. James Hanna of Oak Hill, Ohio.

My maiden name was Sheila Ann Leffel. I was born in 1943 to Claude Spencer Leffel, Sr. and Kate Lee Childress Leffel of Woodbine , MD.

My mother was the daughter of Christopher Columbus Childress of Clintwood, Dickenson County, ${\tt VA}$, ${\tt m}$. to Nickye Long.

My great grandfather was William Childress, m. to Mary Bentley, of Pike County, KY.

My great-greating randfather was Flemon Childress, b. in Ashe County, NC. He was married to Charity Matney of Tazewell County, VA and they settled in Pike County, KY.

My great-great grandfather was Pleasant Childress (Childers), m. to Sarah Jefferies. Pleasant was b. about 1761, enlisted in Warren County, NC, in May, 1780. He married in Buckingham County, VA April 16, 1785. He died in Pike County, KY, August 10, 1843.

The above information is accepted by the D.A.R. and I have no reason to question any of this as my own research substantiates this lineage to William and Mary Bentley. The more current generations are well known to my family.

My interest is in obtaining any information about the Childress (Childers) family before 1761 and any interesting information about the family. I understand that some were in TN and NC and were instrumental in the settlement of Texas. My mother spoke of the connection to Sarah Childress Polk but was unsure where that family fit into the scheme of generations.

I have been in contact with several others Childress descendants over the past 5 years. This has made me aware that the family is a large one and has untold lines! I have not to date been able to establish some connections to other Southwestern Virginia famililes of that name and spelling, as my grandfather was the only male to come to VA from his generation and those who stayed in KY are Childers. I notice the 1880 census lists William as Childers but we feel this was the census taker's spelling, not the family's. The spelling and pronunciation are not an issue with me.

In the name of God, Amen: I Benjamin Childress of the County of Amherst being weak in body though of sound disposing memory for preventing disputes in my family about my estate do make this my last will and testament for disposing thereof:

Imprimis, I give unto my executors hereafter named my tract of land whereon I now dwell, in trust to the intent to preserve, support, educate and maintain all my children untill they severally shall attain to the age of twenty one and then the land to be valued by people not intrusted,

Imprimis: I will that my youngest son Royal shall have one hundred and fifty acres on the plantation whereon I now live. I will that in case he...that he next youngest son shall have it and the other hundred and fifty acres I will that my executors give unto which of my other sons they please. I will that my other sonshave no land receive half the valuation money that the land is valued at and to be paid by those that have the land,

Item: I give unto my said executors my whole estate of all kinds whatsoever in trust to the intent and purpose hereafter mentioned Viz to educate, maintain and bring up all my chiedren until they shall severally attain to the age of twenty one and the rest of my estate to equally divide amongst my beloved wife and daughters each to have an equal share, I desire that my wife and children be kept togerher upon my land and be maintained at the descretion of my executors,

Lastly I constitute and pairs my esteemed friends Thomas Jopling Senr, Josiah Jopling, Thomas Jopling JR, Ralph Jopling executors of this my last will and testament and thus having set my house in order by setting my temporal affairs, I cheerfully submit my eternal concearns to the Wise and Merciful Disposer of all things and patiently wait his mandate for my great change and to this my last will have set my hand and seal this eighteenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy five.

DAR PATRIOT index shows his dob as 25 Dec 1748 in VA. He served in the Revolutionary War in 1779 as a wagoner, hauling corn, wheat, flour, and other produce to the barracks.

He enlisted Oct 1779[1780], under Capt John CHRISTIAN, with his brother Joseph WRIGHT, Benjamuin CHILDRESS and Alexander MOALEXANDER, and returned home at Christmass. He reenlisted in 1781, under Capt James PAMPLIN and was in the Battle of Jamestown.

HONEY IN EARLY AMERICA

Before Congress passed the Subsidiary Coinage Law in 1850, much of American domestic business was transacted with Spanish or other foreign coins, though accounts were kept in either United States or British reckonings. Pennsylvania pounds, shillings, or pence were generally used in accounting in York County until about 1800. Local assessments were used, but the consideration in deeds is occasionally expressed in pounds as late as 1840. Unless otherwise indicated, in Pennsylvania records the terms pounds, shillings, and pence refer to Pennsylvania money. It has exactly three-fifths of the value of the British coins of the same name. The following table of values is valid for all British and American pound systems, including that of Pennsylvania.
