S.C. pilot killed in crash

THE ASSOCIATED PRESS-

MANCHESTER, N.H. — A privately owned vintage military jet crashed Thursday about 1½ miles from the Manchester Airport, killing a Shaw Air Force Base test pilot

Col. John Childers, 50, of Columbia, S.C., was an Air National Guard adviser to the Ninth Air Force commander at Shaw, said Capt. Victor Hines at the Sumter, S.C., base.

Childers, a Citadel graduate, had been stationed at Shaw since 1993 and previously worked at the Pentagon. He is survived by his wife and two children.

The plane went down in woods behind a Ryder truck rentals.

Lee Whittemore, of a nearby frontage road business, said Child-

ers ejected from the single-engine jet just moments before the crash.

The pilot was thrown about 40 feet through the woods and landed in a gravel pit. "He missed a building, clipped some trees and missed the power lines," Whittemore said.

A Ryder worker ran toward the site with fire extinguishers, but there was no sign of an explosion or fire, said Dusty Johnson, who works at nearby Dean's Carpet. Emergency workers performed CPR on the pilot, she said.

"This is an unfortunate incident, but it could have been a lot worse had the aircraft not touched down in a sand pit and had touched down in a residential area," airport spokesman Brian O'Neil said.

On page 55 please correct the marriage date for Charles Horace CHILDRESS and Mabel C. FERGUSON to 1895.

On page 34 in the Spring Clearinghouse there is reference to the obituary for Perdita May (Martin) CHILDRESS who passed away 29 October 1996 in Portland, OR... Virginia Zeboski wrote that "Perdita was one of the nicest, kindest people I've ever known. After his first wife died Clair F. CHILDRESS took his four children to Santa Monica, CA where he met and married Perdita. They later lived in Menlo Park, CA, and still later in Portland where Perdita grew up. She had two daughters by her first husband, both living in Portland". Clair Ferguson CHILDRESS was an uncle of Virginia Zeboski.

Charles Horace CHILDRESS was born 1868 in Benton County, TN, and died 1948 in Paris, TN. In 1895 he married Mabel Clare Ferguson (1870-1924). They were divorced in 1905. Charles Horace CHILDRESS was the son of Rufus A. and Amanda (ALSTON) CHILDRESS who lived near Camden, TN. This family has been in West Tennessee since ca. 1830.

Research Committee

On pages 9 and 10 of the Clearinghouse Newsletter, there is a list of the "Immigrants" who have been located in the records. It is recorded that **John MAIES** received 89 acres for transporting 2 persons, namely - **Philemon CHILDERS** and **Thomas CROMPTON**. Date: October 27, **1673**. Patent Bk. No. 6, p.23, Charles City, VA.

In the English records the **ONLY Philemon CHILDERS** for whom a birth has been located is "1637 Nov. 26 **Philemon, child of Robert CHELDERS, of Churchyard.**" Leeds Parish Registers. (See page 68 of this issue.)

Proof: Philemon CHILDERS was born in 1637, His father was Robert. We do not find proof of a Philemon Childers born in 1645 or 1659.

Someone copied wrong. Please make a note in your files. If you can prove another Philemon as this immigrant, please share with the rest of us.

At the Columbia, SC 1997 meeting, Garland CHILDRESS presented a position paper on the Philemons. The name was used extensively in the early Virginia families.

Three Position Papers were presented in 1997 from the Henrico records.

I. Thomas Norman do swear that I am well acquainted with the above named John Childress and know of his services as above stated for I was in the Battle of Kings Mountain where he reced the wound above spoken of having assisted him home after he reced it.

CIVIL WAR RECORDS

This information from the Indiana State Archives, Indianapolis, IN. (CHILDRESS information and others - later issue.)

A word of caution: like all armies, past and present, mistakes are made in such things as record keeping. Age given could be wrong. Many young men and older would lie about their age. Some boys as young as 10 or 11 often could be found. Note some of the very short 18 year old "men". Invalid corps, and later after a name change, the Veteran Reserve Corps, were made up of men who had been wounded or injured - but were still able to carry a gun. In turn they finished their enlistment far behind the battle lines guarding prison camps or supply areas. All () are mine where notes are not clear or I felt a comment was needed to clarify.

Notes: 1. Men in the same unit have good odds of being related, since units were recruited from the same areas.

- 2. Units with lower numbers were often 90 days or one year enlistments.
- 3. Very high numbered can be short term as well.
- 4. Most of the units in the middle were for the term of three years.
- 5. Note William A. more than likely the same person having reenlisted.
- 6. A Company was approximately one hundred men. A Regiment was approx. one thousand men.
- 7. Knowing the regiment number, you can check the *Official Records of the War of the Rebellion*, 128 volumes.
- 8. The Units will be listed as State Units as most men in the Civil War were in State Regiments- not Federal.
- 9. For Confederate Units, look for your line under their Units by name rather than by number first, such as Smith's Regiment or "Georgia Grays".
- 10. There are many photographs of Regiments and men in the Illinois State Archives, the Library of Congress (on line), and the U.S. Army Military History Institute (on line).

Who knows? Maybe you will find g-g-grandpa John in his uniform!
