

The following records were sent to Dr. Jones from Ms. Sharon Brakefield. They are from the McCUBBINS COLLECTION. These files are in Knoxville, TN.

1762 May 10: Rowan Co., NC, Book 5, page 136

EARL GRANVILLE lets **James FULKERSON** of Rowan County, NC have ___ acres of vacant land on both sides of Crooked Creek in Rowan, but on the Virginia line, beginning on the line, for 10 shillings, witnessed by **John AGAR & John FROHOCK &** proved April 1763.

1777 Nov. 17: Surry County, NC, Book A, page 217

Abraham FULKERSON of Henry County, VA -- no wife signs -- lets **John CHILDERS** of Surry County, NC have 408 acres on both sides of Crooked Creek on the Virginia line where the said **FULKERSON** formerly lived, but where the said **CHILDRESS** now lives, for 150 pounds, witnessed by **Charles BEASLEY, Archt. HUGHES, & Benjamin FARMER &** proved by the last named in Feb. 1778. (this is part of the land which **Earl GRANVILLE** sold to **James FULKERSON** on May 10, 1762 -- see above.)

1791 Aug. 12: Marriage Bond - Nancey CHILDERS to Joseph PARKS,
signed by **Joshua WHITAKER.**

1791 Nov. 12: Marriage Bond: John CHILDERS to Mary LEECH,
signed by **Hugh CUNNINGHAM.**

1798 June 9: Marriage Bond - Judea CHILDRESS to Samuel DAVIS,
signed by **Thomas HARPER.**

1800 Feb. 18: Book 17, page 440

Michael BEARD & John BUIS - no wives sign - let **James CHILDERS** (all of Rowan County, NC) have 243 sq. poles & 6 links in the town of Lexington on Abbots Creek (beginning two poles from the corner on Main St. of lot # 1 & going southwest along Main St. 12 poles in the southwest square, then north 12 poles, then east 12 poles &c., for \$ 1000.00, witnessed by **John H. ZIVELY & William HUNTER &** proved in Aug. 1800. (This is part of the 86 1/2 acres granted by The State to **David EVANS** on Nov. 4, 1784 who let **Michael BEARD** have it Aug. 1, 1789).

McCUBBINS COLLECTION continued ---

1800 Aug. 9: Samuel CHILDRESS age 16 years, a child abandoned by his father, is bound to Samuel DAVIS to learn the trade of a joiner & carpenter & at expiration of his term to receive twenty dollars worth of tools.

1803 Jan. 6: Book 18, page 560

Abraham CHILDRES - no wife signs- lets James CHILDRES (both of Rowan County, NC) have 336 sq. poles in the southwest square of Lexington on Main St. next lot #2 & James CHILDRES, for 250 pounds, witnessed by Samuel WINSTON & Thomas CARSON & proved by the latter in May 1803. (Edward ELTON conveyed this to said Abraham.)

CARSON / CHILDRESS

1804 April 4: The Will of Thomas CARSON of the town of Lexington, Davidson Co., NC; Book F, page 47, Rowan Co., NC, while "Strong and healthy".

Wife: Deborah. Sons: John (111 acres in Guilford County which was bequeathed to said son by Richard SAYERS & he had sold with son's consent for \$ 333.00; also 1/2 of the store and some land bought from Adam HARTMAN & Peter WHITAKER);

Hugh (CARSON) (must finish his education at the University of NC) & James (CARSON) part of the store in Concord, Cabarrus County, NC.

Daughters: Lendicia (whose husband is James CHILDRESS who still owes for a negro bought through him of William BELL as executors of Richard SAYERS):

Polly (land in Montgomery County, NC) : Sally & Betsy:

Executors: son John and friend John LEWIS BEARD.

Witnesses: Samuel DUSENBURY, James ORR, & Samuel DAVIS.

1805 May 28: Book 21, page 260

Dinah SEYERS lets James CHILDRESS (both of Rowan County, NC) have 215 acres on the old line next Christian SEYERS, for \$ 400.00, witnessed by James MACAY & Joseph PARKE & proved by the latter -May 1808. (Richard SEYERS devised this to the said DINAH & it was confirmed by The General Assembly).

1811 Jan. 14: Book 22, page 393

James CHILDRESS of Randolph County, NC -- no wife signs -- lets Samuel LAMBETH of Rowan County, NC have 425 acres on Uharah next --- Campbell, for 550 pounds, witnessed by E. MORGAN & Phillip COPPLE & proved by the latter in Feb. 1812. (This is tract # 34.)

*McCUBBINS COLLECTION continued ----***James CHILDRESS**

1812 Oct 5 : Book 22: page 704

Samuel McCULLOCH & Robert LOCKE (as the executors of **James McCULLOCH**'s Will which wished certain lands sold) lets **James CHILDRESS**-- all of Rowan County, NC -- have 378 acres on both sides the main road leading to Salisbury, on both sides of Crane Creek next **Richard TROTTER** (originally James LOCKE'S), **John CLAREY** & the old field of **John McCLELLAND**, for \$1900.00, witnessed by **John BRANDON & A.W. BRANDON** & proved by the latter in Feb. 1813.

1815 Oct. 26: Book 20, page 500

James CHILDRESS - no wife signs -- lets **Moses A. LOCK** (both of Rowan County, NC) have 378 acres on both sides the main road leading from Salisbury to Beaties Ford, on both sides Crane Creek next **James LOCKE, John McCLELLAND**'s old pin & **R. TROTTER** \$ 2268.00, witnessed by **Thomas TODD & R. LOCKE** & proved by the latter in Feb. 1816.

1815 Nov. 22:

On application of **James CHILDRESS** as the administrator of **William CRAWFORD**, he may sell a Negro, **David**, to make an equal distribution among the distributees.

1816 Feb. 18: Book 24, page 21

Andrew SCHUPING (a German & no wife signs) lets **Captain James CHILDRESS** - both of Rowan County, NC - have 13 acres on Grants Creek next **John LITIKER** (which was formerly **Jacob BOSTIAN**'s but now belonging to the heirs of **Richard TROTTER**) crossing a branch, next **Col. Martin PHIFER**, on the road leading from Beaties Ford on the Catawba River, for \$ 50.00, witnessed by **George MILLER & Matt BRANDON** & proved by the latter in Feb. 1817. (This is part of the land which **Captain Richard GRAHAM** let the now _____.)

1819 March 18: Book 29; page 105

Elizabeth KINCAID, James CHILDRESS & wife Rebecca - the latter couple of Rutherford County, TN. (as heirs of deceased **John KINCAID**) let **David FRALET** of Rowan County, NC have 200 acres on Second & Third Creek where the said deceased formerly lived next **Robert COWAN & Matthew STEWART**, for \$ 400.00, witnessed by **Robert C. FOSTER & Joshua HASKELL** & acknowledged on June 8, 1822 by the **CHILDRESS** couple before **Judge Joshua HASKELL**, while **Elizabeth KINCAID** acknowledged on Aug. 12, 1826 before **Abel Mc BROOM** whose handwriting was proved by **George ROBINSON** in Nov. 1826.

McCUBBINS COLLECTION continued ---

1838 Nov. 23: Book 34, page 123

Thomas G. POLK & wife Mary E. let **Samuel LEMLY** - all of Rowan County, NC - have 705.6 acres on the west side of Grants Creek on the north side of a branch, also 378 acres (which **James CHILDRESS** sold **Moses A. LOCKE** who let **Thomas G. POLK** have it) on the west side of a road leading from Salisbury to Charlotte, for \$ 3500.00, witnessed by **Alexander LONG & Wm. HOWARD** & acknowledged on Nov. 24, 1838.

1840 Oct. 28: Book 35, page 43

Samuel LEMLY, Sr. - no wife signs - lets **Obediah M. SMITH** (both of Rowan County, NC) have 520 acres on the west side of Grants Creek next **M. S. Mc KENZIE**: & 170 acres on the west side of the road leading from Salisbury to Charlotte - the latter being the remainder of 378 acres which **Moses A. LOCKE** got of **James CHILDRESS & Thomas G. POLK** bought of **La LOCKE** - for \$ 3000.00, witnessed by **Samuel REEVES & Henry SMITH** & proven by the latter in Nov. 1840.

The following was also printed - but without book and page number:

1845 August: **Rebecca CHILDERS, Elizabeth ROBINSON, Sabret S. TROTT & James JONES** let **George H. GREEN** have their interest in the land of **Mary and Elizabeth KINCADE** (which the last two inherited from their deceased father, **James KINCADE**), being 56 acres next **John HULIN, Samuel KINCADE** and **George H. GHEEN**, for \$ 142.00, witnessed & proved by **Samuel ELLIOTT** in Aug. 1845.

1851 Dec. 1: Book 41, page 48

Archibald CALDWELL (as **C.M.E.** & as trustee of **Obediah SMITH**, on a petition from the heirs for sale in Nov. 1849 & sold Dec. 26, 1849, being confirmed in May) lets **Burton CRAIGE** - all of Rowan County, NC) - have 520 acres on the west side of Grants Creel next **M.S. Mc KINZIE**: also 170 acres (which is the remainder of 378 acres which **Thomas G. POLK** bought of **Moses A. LOCKE** who got it from **James CHILDRESS**) on the west side of the road from Salisbury to Charlotte, for \$ 2500.00, acknowledged on Aug. 1, 1856.

1851 Dec. 1: Book 41, page 49

Burton CRAIGE of Rowan County, NC - no wife signs - lets **Benjamin SUMNER** of Lincoln County, NC, have the following tracts for \$ 4000.00, witnessed by **Obediah WOODSON** & acknowledged Aug. 7, 1856.

3. **James CRAWFORD**, b. July 8, 1769, m. **Agness COW** ?

4. **Isabella CRAWFORD**, b. May 3, 1771, m. **Thomas WHITE**

5. **William CRAWFORD**, b. Sept. 18, 1773, m. **Mary** (daughter of **Col. Martin PHIFER, Jr.** & wife who was **Elizabeth LOCKE**) who was born Dec. 1, 1784, died in 1860 but had married **James CHILDERS** of N.C. after **William CRAWFORD's** death, and moved to Alabama:

6. **Robert CRAWFORD**, b. April 7, 1776, died unmarried

7. **John CRAWFORD**, b. Dec. 24, 1778, d. April 21, 1834, m. **Ann B. PHIFER** on Oct. 17, 1816. (She was born March 8, 1788 & died Jan. 11, 1855, a daughter of **Col. Martin Phifer, Jr.** whose daughter **Mary** had married **William Crawford** mentioned above.)

8. **Jean CRAWFORD**, b. April 23, 1782, died unmarried in 1811

9. **Martha White CRAWFORD**, b. Feb. 27, 1778, m. **Col. Thomas WILLIAMS** & ____

10. **Elizabeth CRAWFORD**, b. March 28, 1791, m. **William VAUGHN**.

*McCUBBINS COLLECTION continued -----***Goolsbury CHILDRESS of Amherst Co., VA & Texas**

National Historical Magazine, July 1938:

“Excerpts from the reports of the Genealogical Extension Service made during the month included the lineage and service in the Revolutionary War of a **Goolsbury CHILDRESS** of Amherst Co., VA born 1757, married **Nancy SWINNEY** of Amherst Co., VA. He received a pension (which will soon be published by this department) for services as a private in the Virginia Militia. He removed to Garrard Co., KY where he is listed in the census as a pensioner in 1840 having served in the Revolutionary War, and living in the family of **John ORR**.

The wife of **John ORR** was **Nancy CHILDRESS**, a daughter of **Goolsbury CHILDRESS**.

Goolsbury CHILDRESS and **Nancy SWINNEY** were parents of thirteen children. The names of only two of them are available to us, viz: **Nancy** who married **John ORR** and **Capt. Goolsbury CHILDRESS, Jr.** born Amherst Co., VA in 1790, married in **Louisville, KY 1812 to Mary Elizabeth THOMAS**. **Capt. Goolsbury CHILDRESS, Jr.** served as Captain in the War of 1812, and rendered other distinguished services in the Indian wars following that period. He removed to Adams Co., Illinois and later, with a large delegation from Illinois, Kentucky, and Tennessee, went to **Texas**. Here he took an important part in the upbuilding of that state. (This department will welcome the names of the eleven other children of Goolsbury and Nancy Swinney CHILDRESS.)”

National Historical Magazine, August 1938, page 89:

“**S30924. CHILDERS, GOOLSBERRY or GOLDSBY.** Cert. No. 7094
 Issued March 5, **1819**. Act of March 18, 1818. At \$ 8.00 per annum. From Aug. 11, 1818. Kentucky Agency. Virginia Service. Private.
 Application for Pension August 11, 1818. Age, born January 1, 1757.
 Residence at date of app. Garrard County, KY. Residence at date of enlistment.
 He was born January 1, 1757 (place not stated). He entered the service of the United States November 1757, served two years as a private, under **Capt. William McKee** in **Col. James Wood**, 12th Regiment, Virginia Troops. (Place of enlistment and discharge not stated.)
 August 22, **1820 Goolsbury CHILDERS**, resident of Garrard County, Kentucky, his wife, age fifty-six years (no name given).
 They had thirteen children, ten of whom grew to manhood and womanhood, only two of them were living with their parents in 1820. A daughter age nineteen years and a son born April 1807. There is no further family data on file.”


