Last issue in this spot, I mentioned COMPUTERS. From: Eugene R Rogers 1230 SW 22nd Ter. Miami Fl 33145 who writes:

I started out with "Family Tree Maker", and used it for about 6 months, when I reached the limit of persons I could inter (1000). I contacted the manufacturer, and they sent me a new diskette which would allow me to go up to 2000 persons. In about a year, I had reached that limit and again contacted them, they said that was the limit. Later I was talking to a researcher, who had her genealogical data on a computer, so I told her my situation and she suggested "Brother's Keeper", which had no limit. I purchased the program and am still using it.

I have received a diskette for "Family Tree Maker" for Windows, but find it too slow.

A cousin, who is Mormon, sent me a copy of his Personal Ancestral File, which I use sometime, but find it hard to locate what I want.

Another relation has sent me a copy of "Family Origins, which I use to get data from what she has collected. I found it not as versatile as Brother's Keeper.

All four genealogical computer programs has a means of translating their data into a universal language (Gencom), which then can be imported into any other program and put into their data format.

Of the four listed above, I like Brother's Keeper best. It has many advantages over the others.

NOW....for my opinion....for what it is worth...after learning Family Origins...I prefer it over Personal Ancestor File (PAF) and several little rinky dink programs I thought I was getting CHEAP. My Family Origins was only about \$20 and was from Parsons Programs. I called them to find out if there was a limit as to how many persons it would hold. Was told it would hold as much as I had space of memory on my computer. So I feel confident adding names, more names, and more names. It (Family Origins) will print out your information in several forms....Decendancy (sp?) charts, Pedegree and book form. Prints family group records and much more.

NOW...if you are considering the purchase of a computer just be sure you get one with lots of memory space....of course, the more memory space the higher the price, but you can find one priced in the middle range.

NOW....see you thoroughly confused as to COMPUTERS...MEMORY....PROGRAMS etc. etc. etc.

Once you learn the ins and outs and use a computer for your genealogy, you will wish you had had it from the beginning of your research. They ARE fun and helpful to use. NOW YOU ARE ON YOUR OWN.....

I am researching John B CHILDERS b c 1803 Va (I believe he died Tallapoosa Co Al), married/1 Penelope LUNDY in Hancock Co Ga m/2 Martha LUNDY in Hancock Co Ga. He apparently came to Al ca 1844, as his older children were born in Georgia, and after 1844, the records show they were born in Alabama. I believe his daughter, Susan J CHILDERS to be my gr gr grandmother. Susan J CHILDERS m Isaac G. MORRIS in Al prior to 1848 and had 2 daus, Marietta and Rebecca Ann. I lose track of Isaac after 1850, and Susan J MORRIS later married a George W D (or L) PERRY in Al, and I have lost her in the records after that. I have copies of Marietta's and Rebecca Ann's death certificates from the Health Dept here in Jefferson Co Al, and Rebecca's (she d age 92) lists her father as Isaac MORRIS, and her mother's given name is unknown, but the surname was listed as CHILDERN. I assume the person coping the info from the handwritten info provided, mistook the S for an N. My line comes through the dau, Marietta MORRIS who m into the RIGGINS family. Her first husband was thomas RIGGINS who d about a year and a half after they married, and she then m his cousin, M F RIGGINS. Marietta and Moses Ferdinand RIGGINS were my gr grandparents.

- 1698 - will of Abraham, lists wife Ann, sons Abraham, Henry, John, Philemon and Robert
  - Philemon to son Abraham, tract patented 1694 by Nicholas Perkins and Philemon Childers, later sold to Childers by Perkins 1680  
(Note: Nicholas Perkins married Sarah Childers)
  - Philemon to son Thomas, a tract northside of the James, part of a tract granted to Philemon in 1685
- 1700 - Philemon sr. to son Abraham, same land and description
  - Philliman Childers Sr., security for executors of John Woodson, Jr.
- 1703 - Philemon Sr. to Philemon Jr., two tracts north side of the James where Philemon Jr. now lives and the other bounded by William Randolph and Edward Hughes
- 1704 & 5 - tax list names Abraham Sr. and Jr., Philemon Sr. and Jr. and Thomas  
(Note: The record reads Phillip rather than Philemon, but there are existing, microfilmed records that show where the clerk wrote Phillip and the signature was Philemon)
- 1706 - Philemon Sr. to grandchildren Elizabeth and Tabitha, children of his son Abraham, livestock when they are age 16 or marry (the girls born after 1690)
- 1707 - Thomas Childrey from Joseph and Martha Pleasants
- 1711 - Robert security for Richard Ferris, guardian of Robert Moore
  - will of Henry Pew names grandchildren, including Abraham Jr, John and Jane Childers
- 1713 - Humphrey Smith to John and Philemon Smith, witness Thomas and Mary Childers
- 1716 - land on Chickahominy Swamp described as adjacent Philemon Childers (wife Margaret)
- 1717 - will of Philemon Childers, Sr., to sons Philemon, Abraham and Thomas and daughter Mary Smith
- 1718 - William Childers had wife Elizabeth; daughter of William Hobson
- 1720 - deed to Robert Childers from Richard Ferris and William Porter
  - Robert (wife Catherine) land on Bull's branch and on Spring Branch, Chickahominy
  - will of Abraham names son Abraham and daughters Elizabeth and Tabitha, wife Hester
- 1721 - Margaret Childers had son Joseph under age 21 (born after 1700)
  - will of Katherine Babbicum names daughter Mary Childers with son John
- 1723 - William and Elizabeth to John Williams, no land description
  - Abraham Jr. and Elizabeth to Philemon, no land description
  - Robert security for Elizabeth Hill in case vs Richard Scruggs estate
- 1724 - Phillip (Philemon) testified in court that William Ligon had a negro fishing on Sabbath
- 1726 - Robert and Catherine to Charles Winfree of New Kent Co., St. Peter's parish, land in Varina parish on Bull's branch, Chickahominy River
  - Henry Childers and Elizabeth (Hobson) Childers, widow of William, estate appraisal
- 1727 - will of Joseph Pleasants mentions Benjamin Childrey on Four Mile Creek
  - will of Benjamin Hatcher mentions daughter Elizabeth Childers, witness to will was Thomas Childrey
  - will of Henry Childers (married Lucretia Jones) names sons Thomas and Henry, daughters Lucretia, Ann, Martha Jones and Millicent
  - inventory of William Childers (married Elizabeth)
  - John to Abraham, land of Henry Pew will, north side of James near Four Mile Creek, bounded by John Price and Joseph Adkins (they were also grandsons of Henry Pew)
  - inventory of Henry Childers deceased, wife Lucretia deceased
  - Thomas Sr. to son John, tract Philemon now lives on: also deed to son



- 1729 - Abraham and wife Mary to John Bryant, land north side of Four Mile Creek bounded by Joseph Adkins, John Simcock, Strangeman Hutching  
(Note: in 1739 Abraham Childers, Varina, appointed guardian of Strange Hutchens, orphan)
